# Call to Action to Safeguard Coldwater Conservation

A serious issue has arisen that has significant implications for the conservation of coldwater resources and trout habitat. The GBTU Board of Directors needs your help and asks you to take immediate action. This involves the issue of the federal government (FERC) overriding the independence and authority of the state to protect its public and private conservation lands.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Recently, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) granted Tennessee Gas Pipeline (TGP) a Certificate of Convenience and Public Necessity, empowering TGP to build a natural gas pipeline known as the Connecticut Expansion Project (CEP). Two miles of that pipeline will impact over 20 acres in Otis State Forest, Sandisfield Mass. Our state conserved lands are protected by Article 97 of the Articles of Amendments to the Massachusetts Constitution; once placed into conservancy, a two-thirds majority of both houses of the state legislature is required to remove land from conservancy for other uses. FERC's certificate, left unchallenged, will override Article 97 and allow development of this land with the pipeline.

A group of Sandisfield citizens recently filed a motion to stay the FERC certificate, seeking to prevent tree cutting which TGP plans to begin immediately. This group also filed a Notice of Intent to file suit against FERC in U.S District Court, asserting that FERC is violating the Clean Water Act by issuing the certificate without proper Massachusetts permitting. TGP has filed suit in Berkshire County Superior Court to allow it to immediately begin clearing trees in Otis State Forest – that case will be heard on March 31.

We are asking you to write to the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) to:

- Oppose the Tennessee Gas Pipeline (TGP) request of FERC for a notice to proceed with tree-cutting for the Connecticut Expansion Project (CEP), and
- Request a rehearing of FERC's decision to grant a certificate for this project.

DCR has the jurisdiction and responsibility to take these actions.

### **HOW THIS AFFECTS YOU AND TU**

These events set a precedent for the Northeast Energy Direct Project (NED), a pipeline project that directly affects cold-water habitat and that Trout Unlimited is already involved in as an

Intervenor. NED would impact numerous watersheds in Mass, comprising several thousand acres. This will affect numerous privately conserved lands where landowners have transferred rights to the general public, with the help of land trusts, through the use of a Conservation Restriction (CR) or Agricultural Preservation Restriction (APR). If FERC is able to successfully assert its federal preemptive power over Article 97, no conserved land, either public or private, like the West Branch acquisition in Heath would be safe from development.

# **WHAT YOU CAN DO**

It is urgent that you contact DCR Commissioner Leo Roy as soon as possible. Also, please write Gov. Baker, Secretary Matthew Beaton, your state representatives and Congressional delegation, and ask them to fight for Article 97 and the Commonwealth's authority to protect conservation land. Please see contact information below and a letter template for your convenience. The GBTU BOD will be issuing updates on the progress of TU efforts to ensure that NED does not impact cold-water habitats in Massachusetts.

## Sample Letter

Dear <government official>:

With respect to the Connecticut Expansion Project (CEP), I am writing to ask you to take action now to prevent Tennessee Gas Pipeline's (TGP) attempt to begin tree cutting in Otis State Forest. As a member of Trout Unlimited, I am concerned with the precedent that this will set, namely to override Article 97 of the Massachusetts Constitution. This precedent could have significant implications for cold-water resources.

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has issued a certificate for this project that could, if left unchallenged, allow use of this land that was not anticipated when this land was placed into "permanent" protection just nine years ago. Not only does this land have rare and irreplaceable natural resources, this action could set a precedent leading to the impairment of conservation efforts in the Commonwealth.

Therefore, I respectfully ask you that you defend the Commonwealth's interests at the March 31 hearing in Berkshire County Superior Court. I ask that you take this action to ensure that our conserved lands remain protected in perpetuity. Thank you.
