Hi, guys & gals—Red "Q" is semi-back in action. First some sad news....Jerry Sutelman passed away in March and will be sorely missed at CCTU events. Jerry was a regular at the CCTU tying nites, the Chapter Banquet, the FF School and was a loyal attendee at our monthly meetings. He also served on our BOD. Previously a member of the CC Salties and the CC Flyrodders. An all-around good guy. Our thoughts go out to his widow, Pat Sutelman.

<u>RED BROOK</u> workdays are held on the 1st Saturday of the month meet @ the Lyman Reserve parking lot, Head of the Bay Road in Wareham 9am-ish. Those of you who cannot make the Quashnet Workday due to it being held on Sunday can get your conservation "fix" on a Saturday! This project is an ongoing MA/RI Council conservation project staffed mainly by Southeastern MA TUer's. Red Brook info? Warren "Windknot" Winders @ 781-878-1074. CCTU-ers! This is the month to consider your very first foray up to the Indian Head River for shad! No word yet on activity but from past experience now is the time to oil that reel and get started to Pembroke. The Indian Head River is located on the Hanover/Pembroke border and is 3.7 miles long. The Indian Head River was probably a fishing and travel spot for Wompatuck Indians. The river runs through the Luddams Ford Park. In November 1873, Eugene H. Clapp bought the property from George Curtis and built the Clapp Rubber Factory on the river. The factory is no longer there, but the mercury pollution from the factory still clings to the rocks and fish making it unsafe to drink the water and eat the fish. (a great reason to practice "Catch & Release"!) There is an area of earth and tree covered rubbery scrap pits along the river on the Pembroke side which people seem top get a kick out of by bouncing on when walking along. The river now has a man-made dam and fish ladder. Besides the spring shad migration the river is stocked with trout and at one time coho but no longer. There is a historic plaque that is embedded in the wall on the bridge that crosses the river at Elm Street. (Actually two bridges, the newer built at an angle atop the older so both are viewable.) And, altho we now look at the river recreationally as a shad & trout fishery, there is actually quite a long history of manufacturing activity at the site. FYI: The original anchor for the "Constitution" was made right here from local bog iron.
