#### **Quashnet River**

Our monthly workday will be held on Sunday September 11<sup>th</sup>. The meeting place is the gate on Martin Road in Falmouth. If you are available come on out. Bring a pair of waded and work gloves and spend some time working and learning about this little stream.

<u>Electroshocking</u> - Also this month the Steve Hurley of the Massachusetts Fish and Wildlife Southeast District will be doing some electroshocking of the fish in the river. The electroshocking will take place on <u>Wednesday September 21st and Thursday September 22<sup>nd</sup></u>. Volunteers are needed to help with this project. If you are available please come by to help out. Volunteers will be meeting at 9:00am at the Martin Road gate. Please wear waders that do not leak. This is very interesting work and the data obtained by counting and measuring the fish is very important research for the future of this and other salter brook trout rivers.
