Quashnet River Updates from Francis Smith

We had a very productive session on November 17 cutting brush in preparation for the planting of some 270 trees along the banks of the Quashnet River this Spring. The cutting took place in Section 6 with the effort of Charles Orr, Ted Patlen, Tim Lynch Dan Tobin. Thank you for the wonderful effort.

We have an Eagle Scout Project coming up on the River this December where Dillon Cakebread has proposed to cut enough brush to allow for the planting od a minimum of 10 Red Maple trees approximately 6 feet tall with spacing at least 8 feet apart. The project is awaiting approval from the local Boy Scout Council and will likely be scheduled in December and will take place over the period 2 days on during a weekend. Dillon is providing the trees for the project.

Our next scheduled Quashnet River Restoration session will take place December 15. We meet at Martin Road in Falmouth where we proceed to the restoration work site at 9:00 am. Please bring waders, gloves, dress warmly so you can remain comfortable during our morning session on the river. We will again be cutting brush to facilitate the planting of trees this spring. If it is possible to drop the Quashnet's average water temperature during the summer months we will see better brook trout survival and growth rates. We only need to drop that temperature by 4 or 5 degrees and shading the river should accomplish that goal.

Please come on down and get involved, It would be greatly appreciated and I think you will have a interesting morning in many more ways than just cutting brush. Please mark your calendars for the future Quashnet River Restoration Dates: December 15, January 19, February 16, March 15, and April 19. See you on the river!
